**Re: Changes to Durable Medical Equipment (DME)  
dispensed by podiatrists in the Rochester region  
beginning January 15, 2010.**

Dear Dr. <<last name>>:

MVP Health Care ("MVP") is updating its policies to achieve consistency across the entire MVP service area and all lines of business. Beginning January 15, 2010, dispensing of durable medical equipment in the Rochester region will be aligned with all other MVP regions to ensure consistent experience for our members and health care providers in New York State.

This alignment will represent a change in the way durable medical equipment (DME) is dispensed in the Rochester region. Beginning January 15, 2010, podiatrists will not be able to act as a durable medical equipment provider or vendor except as noted below.

Basic durable medical equipment items can be provided for stabilization and safety to prevent further injury, as a convenience to our members without prior authorization. Examples of such items include canes, crutches, walkers (for safe ambulation), "off-the-shelf" bracing, air casts and walking boots (for joint/muscle immobilization to prevent further injury). These items can be billed with the office visit using the appropriate HCPCS code(s) provided they are not listed on the prior authorization list.

**Podiatrists** may provide and bill for foot orthotics, using the appropriate "L" HCPCS codes, when the member's contract includes the Foot Orthotic Rider, without prior authorization.

**Podiatrists** may provide and bill for diabetic shoe inserts and shoes for those members who have a diagnosis of diabetes, with or without a Foot Orthotic Rider, using the appropriate "A" HCPCS codes, without prior authorization.

**Podiatrists** may provide and bill for ankle foot orthotic bracing (L1900 – L1990) and must follow the prior authorization process.

All other DME – orthotics, prosthetics, specialty equipment and services – must be obtained from a participating durable medical equipment, orthotics, prosthetics, or specialty provider or vendor. **For assistance in locating a participating provider or vendor, and to verify member eligibility or member-specific riders, please call (888) 687-6277.** For information regarding DME prosthetics, orthotics and specialty equipment, visit the MVP Web site at [/www.mvphealthcare.com/provider/dme.html](http://www.mvphealthcare.com/provider/dme.html).

Enclosed is an Amendment for Rochester-area podiatrists that outlines the changes noted above. This Amendment is effective January 15, 2010 and, according to the terms of your Medical Services Agreement, it is not necessary for you to sign and return the Amendment.
