Women 16-24 years of age who were identified as sexually active and had at least one chlamydia test during 2024. Two methods identify sexually active women:

- 1. Pharmacy Data: Members who were dispensed prescription contraceptives during 2024
- 2. **Claim/Encounter Data:** Members who had a claim or encounter indicating sexual activity during 2024: diagnoses or procedures indicating sexual activity, or pregnancy tests

Tips and Best Practices to Help Improve Performance

- Utilize the monthly Gaps in Care (GIC) report for a list of MVP Members and screenings still required
- Consider using alerts or flags within the electronic health record (EHR) for screening test due dates
- Discuss the importance of early detection and encourage preventive care screenings—refer annually if needed
- Document medical history, initiation of sexual activity, surgical history, and preventive care—include specific dates and results of tests/screenings
- Encourage member enrollment in local Regional Health Information Organizations (RHIOs); submit all test results to the RHIO when reported
- Use correct diagnosis and procedure codes to submit claims and encounter data in a timely manner
- Stock patient areas and exam rooms with screening educational materials such as those found here:
